Regular Town Council Meeting
April 11, 2023

Present: Chairman David Milligan, Sherri Calhoun, Christopher Bessey, Gerard (Tom) Raymond, Tyler Michaud, Manager Cyr Martin.

- I. **Call Meeting to Order:** The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. by Chairman David Milligan.

- II. **Public Comments:** Matt Stedman, speaking on behalf of the Ashland Sno-Mobile Club, was in attendance asking for the towns support in the purchase of a new groomer in the fall of 2023. A motion was made by Sherri Calhoun, seconded by Tyler Michaud, to approve the agreement as done in the past. Motion carried.

- III. **Consent Items:**
 1. Review, approve and sign minutes from the February 7, 2023 Regular Town Council Meeting, March 21, 2023 Town Meeting Organizational Meeting and March 28, 2023 Special Town Council Meeting. A motion was made by Sherri Calhoun, seconded by Chris Bessey, to approve the noted minutes. Motion carried.

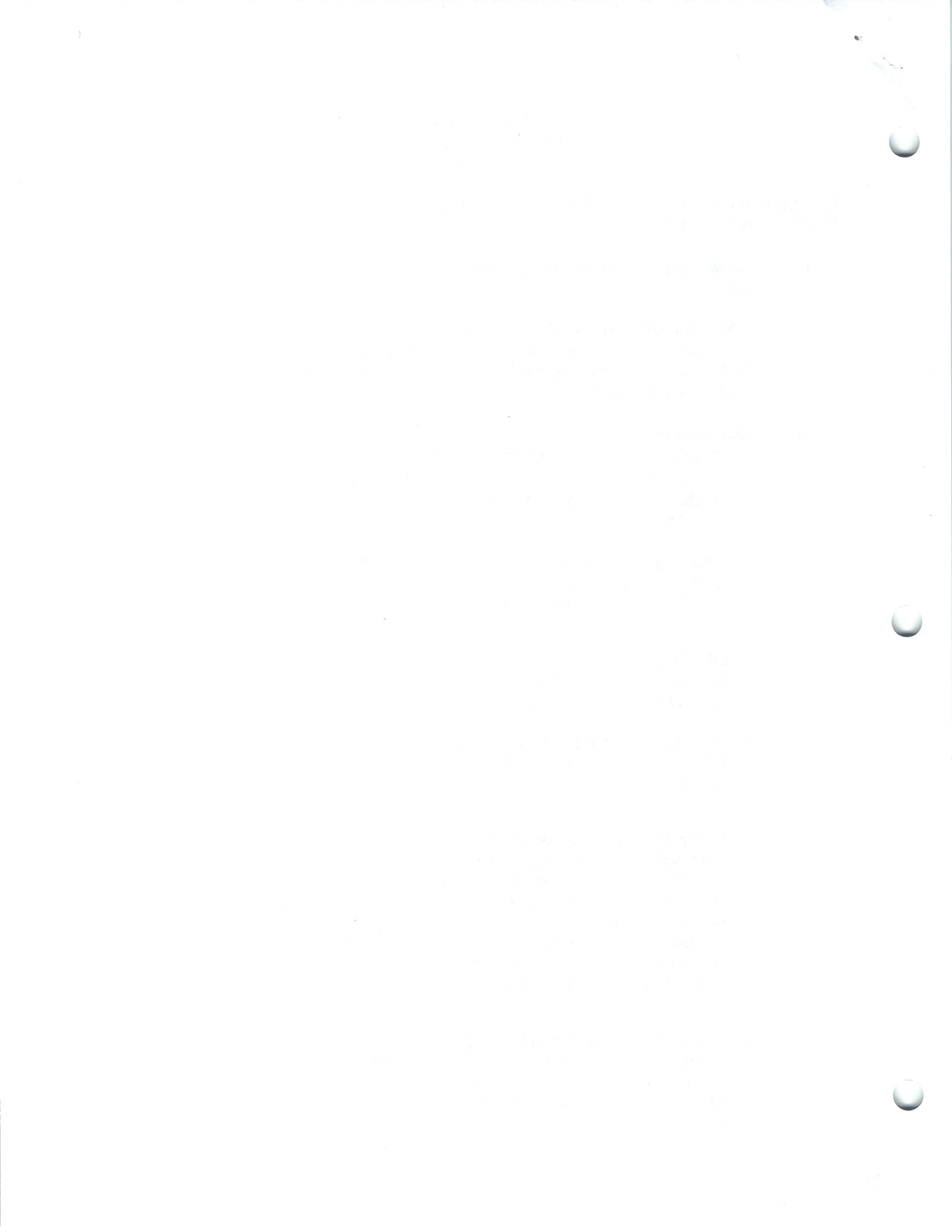
 2. Review, approve and sign treasurer warrants #5V, \$5P, #6V, #7V, #7P, #8V, #8P, #10V, #10P, #11V, #11P, #12P, 12V, #13V and #13P. A motion was made by Sherri Calhoun, seconded by Tom Raymond, to approve the above noted warrants. Motion carried.

- IV. **New Business:**
 1. Approve or disapprove supporting the Ashland Snowmobile Club agreement for buying a new groomer through the town this fall. (Approved under Public Comments)

 2. Sign off on the County Tax Bill to be paid in October. A motion was made by Sherri Calhoun, seconded by Chris Bessey, to approve the 2023 County Tax Bill. Motion carried.

 3. Discuss Fire Department Officers elections and approve or disapprove officers. Fire Chief Don Bouley was in attendance and informed the council of the new officers recently voted in. A discussion ensued on trainings required by the officers as well as nepotism within the department. Councilman Raymond expressed his concerns on only basic trainings being done. Council also discussed possible ways to recruit more individuals to the department. A motion was made by Sherri Calhoun, seconded by Chris Bessey, to update the policy on nepotism and bring back to the council for their approval. Motion carried with one abstention from Tom Raymond.

 4. Discuss and approve or disapprove hiring candidate to fill vacant 3rd full time Paramedic. Manager Martin informed the council he would like to hire Ned Labelle as the new full time Paramedic. A motion was made by Sherri Calhoun, seconded by Chris Bessey, to approve the hiring of Ned Labelle as Paramedic. Motion carried. He is also expecting a new EMT in the near future.



V. **Old Business:**

1. Sign off on old Quit claim release that had not been done since 1990. A motion was made by Sherri Calhoun, seconded by Chris Bessey, to approve the Quit Claim release for Sugar Ridge Lands, Inc. (formerly T11 R5 WELS). Gerald Lee Grace. Motion carried.

VI. **Manager's Report:**

Application for Malt Liquor and Wine License. A motion was made by Sherri Calhoun, seconded by Tom Raymond, to approve the application for Malt Liquor and Wine License for the Old Post Café. Motion carried.

Ashland Care Givers letter – so noted

Manager Martin reported the personnel issue has been resolved and the employee has been terminated.

Manager Martin reported one of our officers will be leaving and has accepted a position with the Presque Isle police department. Tyler Cote will be coming on a reserve officer.

VII. **Council Items:**

Tyler Michaud – inquired about the budget and where extra monies will be allocated to. Manager Martin will put figures together for the next meeting. Also would like the electronic sign reformatted.

Tom Raymond – Inquired about a recent ambulance call. He would also like to see trainings for new personnel. Manager Martin indicated he would keep the council updated.

Chris Bessey - indicated he had received comments about the municipal vault in need of repair.

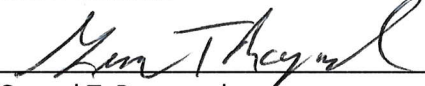
